POSITION DESCRIPTION

The School of Arts and Culture at Mexican Heritage Plaza (SOAC) is a cultural institution that serves both the creative sector and its local neighborhood. SOAC is seeking creative team-players to fill the roles of **Floater Camp Counselor** for seasonal full-time positions. Floater Camp Counselors take direction and report to the Arts Education Program Manager in the execution of their duties and responsibilities.

The **Floater Camp Counselor** will work M - TH from 8:30 am - 4:00 pm and attend weekly staff meetings on TH from 3:30 - 4:30. The Floater Camp Counselor will play a crucial role in supporting our camp counselors and providing assistance as needed. This position requires flexibility, adaptability, and a passion for working with children in a camp setting.

The compensation for this role is \$20 - \$25 per hour for approximately 38-40 hours per week, with some flexibility based on need and supervisor approval. Applications and nominations will be accepted until all positions are filled.

GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES AND DUTIES

- Assist camp counselors with various tasks throughout the camp day, including but not limited to setup, cleanup, and supervision of campers.
- Act as a substitute counselor when needed, filling in for absences or providing additional support during busy periods.
- Support the implementation of camp activities, ensuring the safety and well-being of all campers.
- Foster positive relationships with campers, providing guidance, encouragement, and assistance as needed.
- Collaborate with camp leadership team to maintain a positive and inclusive camp environment.
- Communicate effectively with camp counselors, campers, and parents to address any concerns or issues that may arise.
- Participate in training sessions and staff meetings as required.
- Be a role model to campers and staff by maintaining a positive attitude when interacting with campers, other staff, and camp families, and set a good example to campers and others in regard to general camp procedures and practices, including sanitation, schedule, and sportsmanship
- Adhere to and enforce Camp policies and procedures, including additional COVID-19 safety measures, and operate all activities in a safe manner
- Represent the School of Arts and Culture in a professional manner and provide excellent customer service and handle parent concerns and questions promptly and appropriately; inform Managers when relevant
- Create and actively promote a comfortable and welcoming environment where every participant is treated with dignity and respect, in a friendly, personalized manner
- Create positive group dynamics, fostering connections and positive group growth, and be intentional throughout camp to foster and teach positive values
- Ensure that all spaces used within the Plaza, and program equipment are clean and well-maintained
- Maintain high standards of health and safety in all activities for campers and staff
- Reinforce camp communication; remain well informed of camp schedules and activities and work with Managers to facilitate camp operations while guiding students through the schedule of activities
- Perform other related duties as assigned by management

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS

- 1) At least 18 Years of age + High School Diploma or GED Equivalent
- 2) 1+ years of experience working with youth in a camp or other recreational setting
- 3) Knowledge of the Mexican Heritage Plaza facility
- 4) Adjust quickly to changes with an open mind and flexibility
- 5) Recognize and respond to emergency situations
- 6) Ability to meaningfully engage with all age levels in the camp
- 7) Strong interpersonal and communication skills. Ability to communicate information clearly (both written
- 8) and oral)
- 9) Has a strong sense of collaboration, teamwork, and service in their approach to the work as Camp Counselor.
- 10) Ability to make sound independent judgments and decisions when circumstances arise
- 11) Positive, upbeat, and enthusiastic about working with children
- 12) Ability to work effectively and cooperatively with a diverse group that includes SOAC staff, parents, children, and
- 13) the public
- 14) Must pass a background check which allows work with children
- 15) Must provide proof of vaccination against Covid-19, including a booster vaccination
